





FOREWORD

This booklet covers the various activities and achievements of the National Security Division for the financial 2016-2017. It would be appropriate to point out at the outset that National Security Division is a relatively new Division which was established in January 2014 on the directives of the Prime Minister. In its initial phase, the Division remained engaged in setting up various administrative mechanisms to ensure its smooth functioning and to fulfil its mandate in line with the vital functions assigned to it under the Rules of Business 1973.

The immediate task before National Security Division soon after establishment was to fulfill its foremost function of providing secretariat support to the National Security Committee, the principal decision making body on national security matters. The Division discharged this responsibility efficiently and meetings of the NSC were convened as and when required by the political leadership. Since January 2014 to date, the Committee has met on thirteen (13) occasions, with four (4) meetings falling in the period under review. The meetings provided opportunity to the political and military leadership to discuss and make decisions on important national security issues including situation in Kashmir; relations with Afghanistan, India and US; implementation of NAP, CPEC and other pressing matters of internal and external security.

Another task of vital task before the Division is to work on drafting the first ever national security policy of the country. National security is a multi-dimensional concept. It has to encompass all challenges that confront the state and its people. Need to undertake wide-ranging consultations and an in-depth situation analysis has, therefore, been high on our agenda. Linkages and coordination mechanisms have been identified and put in place. The National Security Division has embarked on comprehensive discussions to understand, homogenize and draw a coherent picture for the preparation of National Security Policy.

Dialogue partners include Federal and provincial Divisions and Departments, Parliamentarians, Think Tanks, Professionals, and the civil society.

As part of its overall mandate, the Division has initiated National Security Dialogue with international partners for enhancing understanding and cooperation on security matters. Dialogues have been held with Japan, Iran and Russia. Contacts have been established with Afghanistan, India and US. Consultations with Tajikistan, Nigeria and Egypt are in the pipeline. Besides, regular meetings are also held with foreign diplomats in Islamabad.

The Division has a lean structure but the assigned tasks are highly important and sensitive. This requires a watchful approach and liaison with relevant Ministries and organizations.

These and other such activities are being documented here with the hope that it will serve as an important reference for the public, scholars, researchers and public sector entities.


VISION

FUNCTIONS

The following core functions have been assigned to the National Security Division under the Rules of Business 1973.

- Function as Secretariat of the National Security Committee (NSC).
- Convene meetings of the National Security Committee.
- Collect, coordinate and collate proposals and input from all relevant Ministries and organizations for consideration of the NSC.
- Formulate comprehensive National Security policy for approval of the National Security Committee.
- Coordinate the implementation of strategies and policies approved by the NSC through relevant Ministries and organizations.
- Formulate strategies and implement them in collaboration with Ministry of Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage to counter negative propaganda against Pakistan and its institutions through its internal and external publicity Wings, under the guidance of NSC.
- Seek, analyze and utilize policy inputs from the Planning Committee on National Security, public and private sector think tanks and other experts in the fields of internal and external security, foreign affairs, defense and economy.
- Brief the Parliament and its Committees on national security related issues.
- Conduct national security dialogue with other countries in consultation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs; and
- Interact with counterpart National Security Councils of other countries.

Composition of the National Security Committee

The National Security Committee (NSC) is the principal decision making body on national security matters. The NSC is supported by two sub-committees – a Planning committee and a Research Committee/Advisory Board. The former identifies issues and topics for research by the latter. The current composition of NSC is as follows:

ACTIVITIES/ACHIEVEMENTS

Meetings of the National Security Committee

National Security Division coordinates and provides secretarial support to the meetings of the National Security Committee, which are convened from time to time on the directive of the Prime Minister. The Committee has met thirteen (13) times since its establishment in August 2013. Four meetings were held during the period under review, as briefly detailed below:

Sixth meeting of NSC, 22nd July 2016

The sixth meeting was convened mainly to review the situation in Indian Occupied Kashmir and to assess progress on the National Action Plan. The meeting unanimously expressed grave concern over the deteriorating situation in the Indian Occupied Kashmir in the wake of Martyrdom of indigenous Kashmiri freedom fighter Mr. Burhanuddin Muzaffar Wani. The meeting strongly condemned the subsequent continuing brutal oppression of the Indian security forces over innocent Kashmiris who have been peacefully protesting against this Martyrdom. The meeting resolved that Pakistan will approach the Human Rights Council of the United Nations on its own behalf and on behalf of OIC Contact Group on Kashmir to send a fact finding mission to Indian Occupied Kashmir for investigating the slaughter of innocent civilians and impose a ban on the use of pellet guns for dispersing people exercising their right to protest. The meeting called upon the international community to condemn these blatant human rights violations by Indian security forces and play their role in ensuring the realization of human rights of the Kashmiri people through fulfilling its commitments towards the people of Jammu and Kashmir under the UNSC resolutions.

While lauding the relentless and unmatched contributions and sacrifices of Pakistan's armed forces and security personnel, particularly in the ongoing Operation Zarb-e-Azb, the meeting expressed satisfaction over the gains achieved so far in effectively ensuring national security. The meeting reaffirmed its resolve against elimination of terrorism and extremism from the motherland. The meeting appreciated the role of military and civil intelligence agencies against the nefarious designs of the international agencies and hostile countries. The meeting decided that effective border management system between Pakistan and Afghanistan should be introduced and enforced as it is in the interest of both the countries.

Seventh meeting NSC, 4th October 2016

The meeting was held in the backdrop of rising tensions on the LoC and the Indian claim of having conducted a surgical strike in Pakistan's territory. The meeting reviewed the situation on the Line of Control and overall internal and external security situation of the country with particular reference to and operational preparedness of the armed forces. Expressing complete satisfaction over operational preparedness of the valiant armed forces, the forum resolved that the entire nation stands shoulder to shoulder with its armed forces and will ensure defence of the country at any cost. The meeting reiterated that the people of Indian Occupied Kashmir were struggling for their inalienable right of self-determination guaranteed by the UNSC resolutions, which cannot be suppressed through brutal oppression by Indian security forces. The participants of the meeting noted that Pakistan is effectively fighting terrorism and has made phenomenal progresses in war against terrorism. Escalation on LoC and Eastern borders will shift Pakistan's focus away from its efforts to eliminate terrorism from our soil at a critical stage, and is detrimental to the successes made by Pakistan in war on terror. Nevertheless, Pakistani nation and its Armed Forces are fully prepared to respond to any threats.

Referring to recent propaganda and false claims of surgical strikes made by India, the forum concluded that India should resolve the long standing issue of Kashmir for enduring peace in the region, instead of such futile efforts of diverting attention of the world. India must stop atrocities in Kashmir and recognize the just and legitimate struggle of Kashmiris for their right of self-determination.

Eighth meeting of NSC, 31st May 2017

During its seventh meeting held on 31st May 2017, the National Security Committee deliberated upon overall internal and external security situation of the country. Situation on eastern and western borders was also discussed. National Security Committee expressed serious concern over the atrocities of Indian forces on the innocent people of Jammu and Kashmir and resolved to continue moral and diplomatic support to the Kashmiris. The Committee also expressed satisfaction over the sustained gains achieved from anti-terrorism operations, particularly Operation Radd-ul-Fasaad. Security for China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) projects also came under discussion during the meeting.

Ninth meeting of NSC, 7 June 2017

The ninth meeting of NSC was held in the backdrop of grave deterioration in the security situation in Afghanistan. Taking note of the massive explosion in Kabul which killed over a hundred people, the NSC strongly condemned this brutal incident of terrorism in Kabul and resolved to remain steadfast and resolute in support of Afghan people. Participants of the committee expressed concern on the deteriorating security situation in Afghanistan and strongly rejected the baseless allegations against Pakistan in that context.

It was highlighted that Pakistan was the only country in the Afghan equation which has achieved clear and measurable success against terrorism despite limited capacity and huge human and economic costs. Pakistan has not only remained committed to a peaceful and stable Afghanistan but also worked with all regional and global initiatives to that end. At the same time Pakistan has shown exceptional restraint even when Afghan territory was used for terrorist acts in Pakistan which resulted in massive human losses. Pakistan was fully cognizant of institutional collaboration by elements hostile to Pakistan and will defend itself resolutely against manifest and future threats. The Committee expressed the resolve and commitment to continue Pakistan's ongoing efforts for local, regional and global peace.

Formulation of National Security Policy

National Security Division has also been assigned to conduct nation-wide consultations on a draft National Security Policy (NSP) encompassing all issues relating to national security including challenges to national sovereignty and territorial integrity as well as issues concerning human security i.e. energy, water, food security, protection of rights of all citizens, governance and economic empowerment of the people of Pakistan. Dialogue with concerned stakeholders is underway to make the exercise objective and inclusive.

Security dialogue with international counterparts

Another essential/core function of the National Security Division is to establish links and initiate dialogue with national security agencies of other countries with a view to enhancing understanding for Pakistan's security situation and promote bilateral/multilateral cooperation on counter-terrorism and security matters. In this regard, the Division has initiated National Security Dialogue with several international partners including Japan, Iran and Russia. National Security Adviser Lt. Gen. Nasser Khan Janjua paid an official visit to Japan in December 2016 to exchange views with Japanese leadership on issues of regional security. During the visit, the Adviser held detailed discussions with his Japanese counterpart besides meeting the Japanese Minister for Defence, the State Minister for Foreign Affairs and several senior defence and security officials. The visit paved the way for the return visit to Pakistan by Japan's State Minister for Foreign Affairs Mr. Nobou Kishi.

As part of periodic regional security consultations, National Security Adviser Lt. Gen. (Ret.) Nasser Khan Janjua visited Russia on 22-25 May 2017 to attend the 8th International Meeting of High Ranking Officials Responsible for Security Matters, which was held in Zavidovo Resort on the outskirts of Moscow. The themes for the 2017 meeting were "The main directions of international cooperation in fighting transnational organized crime" and "The role of modern technologies in the international information security and measures to maintain". During the course of the conference, the Advisor delivered a statement in the plenary session to projects Pakistan's policy and efforts for maintenance of peace and stability in the region and our significant achievements in counterterrorism. The Adviser also held side-line meetings with his counterparts from Russia, China, Afghanistan and Egypt.

In the context of the tense security situation on our Eastern and Western borders, National Security Adviser has established useful contacts with his counterparts from Afghanistan, India and US and efforts are being made for creating a common ground for sustained and structured security dialogue with these important countries. As ongoing work, consultations with Tajikistan, Nigeria and Egypt are in the pipeline.

National Security Adviser Meetings with foreign dignitaries

In order to maintain regular liaison with important countries and to explore avenues for new dialogue partners, National Security Adviser has been meeting with foreign diplomats based in Islamabad, as and when required, and receiving foreign security officials during their visits to Islamabad. 


