







## FOREWORD

This booklet covers activities and achievements of the National Security Division (NSD) during financial year 2021-2022. It would not be out of place to mention at the outset that the National Security Division is relatively a new Division. It was established, on the directives of the Prime Minister, in January 2014. In its initial phase, the Division remained engaged in setting up administrative mechanisms to ensure its smooth functioning and to fulfill its mandate in line with its functions assigned under the Rules of Business 1973.

The immediate task before the Division, soon after its establishment, was to fulfill its function of providing secretariat support to the National Security Committee (NSC), the principal decision making body on national security matters. The Division discharged this responsibility efficiently and meetings of NSC were convened as and when desired by the political leadership. Since August 2013, the Committee has met on Thirty-Nine (39) occasions. The meetings afforded an opportunity to political and military leadership to discuss and make decisions on national security issues including situation in the Indian Occupied Jammu & Kashmir (IOJ&K); Pakistan's relations with Afghanistan, China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) and other important matters of internal and external security.

Another task of the Division was to formulate, the first ever, National Security Policy (NSP) of the country which was inaugurated by the Prime Minister of Pakistan on 14<sup>th</sup> January, 2022.

As part of its overall mandate, the Division has initiated National Security dialogue with international counterparts for enhancing understanding and forging cooperation on security matters. Dialogues have been held with counterparts from USA, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and Turkiye. Furthermore, regular meetings are also held with Islamabad-based foreign diplomats.

As regards the administrative structure of the Division, an important addition to it is the Strategic Policy Planning Cell (SPPC) which comes under National Security Division.

These and other such activities are being documented, in the pages that follow, towards the fulfilment of the requirement laid down under sub-rule (2) & (3) of Rules of Business, 1973. At the same time, it is hoped that this brief report would serve as a useful reference to public sector stakeholders, scholars, researchers and the general public.

## **VISION**

Pakistan is envisioned as an Islamic welfare state, internationally relevant and aligned with universal principles of justice, equality and tolerance. ## **MISSION**

The National Security Division endeavors to promote and integrate initiatives on national security and strategic policy planning under a holistic National Security Policy based on the principles of the Constitution of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan. The Division seeks to promote a unified national narrative on a broad-based conception of National Security, and remains committed to providing administrative and intellectual support to the National Security Committee (NSC), Pakistan's premier decision making forum on national security, and all relevant stakeholders. Appreciating Pakistan's complex security requirements, the Division is geared to build international synergies by holding security dialogues with partner countries to strengthen Pakistan's global cooperation on matters of security.

## **FUNCTIONS UNDER RULES OF BUSINESS 1973**

Following are the core functions assigned to the National Security Division under Government of Pakistan, Rules of Business 1973:

1. Function as Secretariat of the National Security Committee (NSC).
2. Convene meetings of the National Security Committee.
3. Collect, coordinate and collate proposals and input from all relevant Ministries and organizations for consideration of the NSC.
4. Formulate comprehensive National Security policy for approval of the National Security Committee as well as ensure its sustainability through monitoring of its implementation and undertaking periodical review / updation in consultation with all the stakeholders as required.
5. Coordinate the implementation of strategies and policies approved by the NSC through relevant Ministries and organizations.
6. Develop national narrative to promote the national security vision outlined in the NSP and counter the negative and obscurantist ideology of the extremists, terrorists, and militants.
7. Provide administrative and financial management support to the functionally independent Strategic Policy Planning Cell (SPPC) and coordinate all intellectual / research and dialogue – based activities through the SPPC.
8. Brief the Parliament and its Committees on national security related issues.
9. Conduct national security dialogue with other countries in consultation with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
10. Interact with counterpart National Security Councils of other countries.
11. Organize Islamabad Security Dialogue on regular basis.

## National Security Committee

National Security Committee (NSC) is the principal decision making body of the country on national security matters. Composition of NSC is as follows:

### ***Planning Committee***

#### **Composition**

- National Security Adviser (NSA); Chair
- Secretary Foreign Affairs;
- Secretary Defence;
- Secretary Interior;
- Secretary National Security;
- Heads of the relevant intelligence agencies;
- Chief of General Staff; and
- Any other official by special invitation.

#### **Functions**

- Identify security issues on which research is required;
- Make arrangements for carrying out research by public and private sector institutions;
- Prepare necessary policy briefs and working papers for consideration of the NSC; and
- Prepare material on national security issues for presentation to the Parliament.

#### ***Advisory Board:-***

Eleven meetings of the Advisory Board held in 2021-22

#### **Composition**

- National Security Adviser (NSA); Chair
- Secretary, National Security Division; Deputy Chair
- Director General, Institute of Strategic Studies (ISS), Islamabad;
- President, Institute of Regional Studies (IRS), Islamabad;
- Director General, Institute of Strategic Studies, Research & Analysis (ISSRA) of the NDU, Islamabad; and
- Any other think tank or person of eminence with expertise in strategic and foreign policy issues.

#### **Functions**

- Conduct research on national security issues under the supervision of the National Security Division;
- Brief the Planning Committee on national security issues as and when required; and
- Organize national and international seminars on national security issues.

## **ACTIVITIES/ACHIEVEMENTS DURING THE YEAR**

### **National Security Policy:-**

National Security Division has formulated the 1<sup>st</sup> ever Comprehensive National Security Policy of Pakistan which was approved by the Federal Cabinet on 28-12-2021 and launched on 14-01-2022. Furthermore, this Division has been providing research based policy inputs to the Prime Minister's Office and other stake holders for policy formulation.

### **Security Dialogue with International Counterparts**

Another essential/core function of National Security Division is to establish linkages and initiate dialogue with national security agencies of other countries with a view to enhance understanding for Pakistan's security situation and promote bilateral/multilateral cooperation on counter-terrorism and security matters. In this regard, the Division has initiated national security dialogue with international partners.

**MOUS:** - Protocol signed between the Government of Islamic Republic of Pakistan and Government of the Republic of Uzbekistan on the establishment of the Joint Security Commission on 2-11-2021.

### **Islamabad Security Dialogue:-**

This division also arranged 2<sup>nd</sup> Edition of Islamabad Security Dialogue on 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2022 to initiate a debate of Pakistan's National Security Narrative at international level and establish Pakistan as an international thought leader. The Islamabad Security Dialogue included National Security Advisors of China, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Turkiye, Saudi Arabia and Qatar who presented their remarks at the conference, in addition to over 40 high profile international and national speakers, including Prime Minister, Chief of Army Staff and Senior Federal Ministers. ### **Automation through Deployment of E-Office System:**

Automation of file keeping and communication protocols within the Division as well as with other Ministries/Divisions have been brought in line to with NITB's E-Office System. The NSD is currently ahead of the digitization timeline as it is operated on Level-4 of the E-Office system with respect to its daily functioning.

## **Hardening of Security Protocols**

In light of the cyber-security threats faced by NSD and other Ministries / government agencies, the NSD has been able to implement rigorous and updated security protocols for data protection and cyber-security. Staff from NSD and SPPC have been trained on and provided with Standard Operating Procedures developed to ensure safety of sensitive data.

## **Rejuvenating Advisory Board**

NSD has focused specially on activating the Advisory Board to ensure input from partnering think tanks on relevant and vital issues policy input for premieres. In addition, this has enabled NSD to work closely with think tanks to provide direction.

## **Building a Culture of Excellence**

Significantly, the NSD continues strive to operate with a degree of professional excellence, befitting of the responsibility placed upon us. The NSD and SPPC strive to think and work with a strong emphasis on functioning as a collective unit that does not promote any undue hierarchy, sycophancy, or entitlement that could plague policy formulation.
